EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- DINÂMIA'CET (DC) consolidated a set of research subjects that represent societal challenges and have long been explored by its members. The research has centred around six major subjects and varying specific topics.
- Those similar subjects are being examined through specific and complementary theoretical and methodological options. This strategy allows a more comprehensive view of outcomes, and involves different DC research groups, within the integrated thematic lines.
- New topics were immediately addressed and provided insights on different perspectives, as is the case of the (post-)pandemic. It was explored through housing lens, but also through the labour market view.
- The internationalisation process was reinforced with the ERC Starting Grant in progress, and a new Advanced grant in the field of architecture. Additionally, a considerable number of international networks (117) and the countries involved illustrates the ability of DC researchers to diversify their geography and engage with foreign partners (notably Spain, France, United Kingdom, Italy, and many other countries). The consolidation of the team internationalisation process and of DC as host institution complete this cross-border research endeavour (e.g., 15 visiting researchers).
- Research at DC resulted in an increase in funded projects, with relevant themes of current economic, social and territorial interest. In 2023 there were about 38 research projects underway, 13 of which started this year, and 13 were completed, although the dissemination of their findings continued in the current year.
- 41 research project proposals were submitted to a variety of funding opportunities. The diversification of funding sources remains a strategic option and the data show that over 29% of project funding comes from FCT programmes, but 16% result from European Commission initiatives, 24% are contracted with municipalities and other national public sources, while the remaining 32% have different or self-funding sources.
- 80 scientific events and activities were planned under the three Research Groups, organized and co-organized by DC.
- 389 publications were produced in 2023 by DC researchers, 73 of them indexed in WoS and/or Scopus. 52 Books and 90 book chapters are also included in these figures targeting wide audiences, especially in Portuguese language.
- The DC online journal, *CIDADES, Comunidades e Territórios* (Q3 Scimago Journal Ranking for Urban Studies), has increased submissions on varying subjects, with special issues covering topical subjects as territorial dimensions of political economy, or the access to housing for the most vulnerable groups.

- The *Working Paper series* continues to be a source of dissemination of ongoing research, with similar figures for 2022 and 2023 (4).
- The *Portuguese Journal of Social Science* continues to be supported by DC and also serving as source of outputs dissemination.
- The year of 2023 was marked by a greater proximity to society, albeit traditional research activities remained very active. 216 papers were presented in scientific events along the three research groups, with special emphasis on international events (122).
- DC has consolidated two research structures which systematize information on relevant themes in Portuguese society. One structure is the Youth Employment Observatory (YEO) that created a data repository on the youth labour market, notably youth unemployment, quality of youth employment, and youth employment policies. At the beginning of 2023, the YEO signed a protocol with the Portuguese public employment services, IEFP, establishing the cooperation in the development of a series of studies on Youth Employment, Unemployment and Labour Market.
- A second research structure is the LXHabidata Platform, a database that gathers permanently updated housing data for the municipalities and parishes of the Lisbon Metropolitan Area. In 2023, LXHabidata inspired a proposal to establish an observatory dedicated to housing dynamics. Simultaneously, this platform has supported various initiatives, discussions, and participations in the media related to housing issues.

1. INTRODUCTION

The year of 2023 was noticeable by systematic analysis of the research carried out in last decades, which made it possible to summarise the range of subjects worked on at the DINÂMIA'CET (DC). This preliminary task represented the major input to prepare the DC evaluation, either to summarise the last five years activities or to plan the research for the next five years. The goal was to determine the DC strongest research subjects and examine how the research groups have been working on them. In this sense, it has been possible to determine the major debates in which the DC participates with its research; to identify consolidated topics on which it should continue to work; and to define emerging areas in which it is necessary to devote attention. So, reflecting on the work developed so far, and preparing for future work were important milestones in the year of 2023.

The analysis showed that some prominent topics are transversal to all research groups. It additionally shows the timeliness of the research and the intention to contribute to the identification of potential solutions. These topics regard the housing, youth employment, job quality, and tourism. The sustainability and ecological issues have also received wide attention, not only through publications, but also through funded projects and major international conferences organised by the DC.

The reinforcement of the internationalisation process is a key outcome of the 2023. This process includes two ERC grants, advanced and starting; the strengthening of international networks; cost actions; and the international recognition of research.

The diversity of funding sources remains a central concern of the DC and the grants obtained in 2023 illustrate multilevel sources, including EU, national funding through FCT, municipalities and other institutions. Major efforts have been developed to access grants for individual research through varying sources. The variety of sources demonstrates the academic impact of the research developed so far, but also the engagement of researchers with local and national stakeholders. The co-production of knowledge involving stakeholders in research is an example of close ties between DC and communities. In some research, stakeholders participate in early tasks, namely design of the projects, and appears as co-constructors of knowledge.

Additionally, research has been developed through direct interaction with policy makers to support the diagnosis of the social and economic phenomena and help design the adequate public policies. The research takes advantage of available datasets and applies proper statistical tools to identify specific problems (IEFP). It has attracted wide attention of the media, with the engagement of DC members in debates, comments, and opinion pieces. In fact, some DC members regularly participate in the media to discuss major economic and social issues. This intervention contributes to increase the visibility of the DC research, but also to raise awareness for some emergent topics that deserve proper scrutiny.

The implementation of the research agenda involves not only collective and individual projects, but also scientific observation structures, namely the Youth Employment Observatory and LXHabidata. These platforms constitute sources of updated data on crucial topics and create room for engagement with different stakeholders.

2. RESEARCH AGENDA AND OUTCOMES

2.1. DC and its Scientific Identity

DC, Centre for the Study of Socioeconomic Change and the Territory at Iscte, is a research unit that conducts fundamental and applied research on emerging societal issues, addressing socioeconomic, cultural and political factors that impact and shape the topics being studied.

Using inter and transdisciplinary methodologies, the DC takes a subject/problem-based approach to generating knowledge, that contributes to understanding the complexities inherent to contemporary challenges and fostering sustainable solutions. It considers the interplay between public and private actors across various domains and within public policies; operates at analytical and normative levels; employs qualitative and quantitative methods; and utilises primary and secondary data to study processes, drivers, patterns, impacts, and actions.

DC actively promotes the co-construction of knowledge transfer, supports dialogues with political decision-makers, public administration, the private sector and civil society and recommends policies to improve well-being and ensure a just transition.

2.2. The Research and Major Subjects

The DC commissioned a study to analyse its publications to prepare the evaluation process. This task involved detailed examination of all types of publications of DC members and a collective discussion on the major common subjects that characterise DC research and the value added for the academic, social, and political debate. This analysis has made it possible to visualise how common themes across research groups and integrated thematic lines involve different but complementary approaches. In this way, it has been possible to identify and discuss how the specific research fits together to help acquiring a comprehensive idea of major issues and reinforce DC identity.

The research is centred around six major subjects that aim to cover contemporary societal challenges. It comprises creativity and social change; ecological and digital transition; historical and postcolonial perspectives; housing and urban dynamics; labour, regulation and inequalities; and territorial cohesion. DC researchers have engaged to consolidate knowledge and expertise in those broad subjects through specific, and often overlapped, thematics.

1. Ecological and digital transition: remains a focal point drawing numerous members due to its overarching associated subjects:

- **Sustainability:** climate change; and renewable energies;
- **Innovation:** technological change;

- 2. Territorial cohesion:** include political initiatives to reduce regional gaps.
 - **Urban planning:** city concepts.
 - **Food:** food landscapes.

- 3. Labour, regulation and inequalities:** examine economic issues, labour market outcomes, its institutions, and effects:
 - **Financialisation:** housing and economic policies;
 - **Job quality:** employment conditions of young people; quality of work; well-being; and regulation;
 - **Employability of graduates:** expansion of higher education and skill problems;
 - **Ageing:** employment of older workers and organizational support;
 - **Pandemic:** transition into the labour market and mental health.

- 4. Housing and urban dynamics:** covers issues related to housing and its socioeconomic and urban effects:
 - **Housing:** historical perspective; struggles; and technical issues
 - **Pandemic:** housing precarity.

- 5. Historical and postcolonial perspectives:** research attempts decoding the social production of space:
 - **History of Portuguese architecture:** comparatively to other countries and colonial regimes.

- 6. Creativity and social change:** focuses on cultural and creative ecosystems as manifestations of hybrid and marginal structures. The research includes:
 - **Arts & Culture:** cultural activities, cultural institutions and creative agents;
 - **Tourism:** creative and thematic tourism.

Table 1 illustrates the main topics and DC key research areas explored by each Integrating Thematic Line (ITL), by each Research Group (RG) and the overlapping across those lines and groups. It includes the themes explored and published across various types of publications. As can be seen, four subjects, housing, innovation, job quality, and tourism, are common to all integrating thematic lines and to all research groups. The pandemic and sustainability are also explored by almost all research groups. Other topics reflect specificities of each line or group. In the same way, when we consider the DC's key research areas, we realise that the ecological and digital transition, housing and urban dynamics and labour, regulation and inequalities are areas addressed by all the integrating thematic lines and by all the research groups. The communalities illustrate that similar subjects

are being examined through specific and complementary theoretical and methodological options. This allows a more comprehensive view of those outcomes.

The subjects explored by different RG involved specific approaches and often different scientific fields of education. For example, job quality was examined through the political economy, law, sociological, and social psychology lens. The tourism involves historical and territorial perspective, but also marketing approach. These examples show that different perspectives on the same object enhance comprehensive knowledge about that object. They also reveal the complementary among the research developed across members of different RG and across different ITL.

Furthermore, DC continues to devote especial attention to some timeliness subjects, as is the case of sustainability that aggregates almost all RG and ITL. Research has acquired wide international recognition namely the inclusion of DC work in the latest IPCC report; and research awards for papers with societal impact by the Financial Times.

The pandemic impacts were immediately addressed by DC members and, once again, involved the views of labour, housing, and territorial issues.

In sum, the research increasingly tends to follow a logic of looking at the objects and integrate different scientific perspectives that guarantee a better understanding of the phenomena. Thus, the inter and multidisciplinary approaches that characterise research of DC are giving way to transdisciplinarity.

Chart 1 illustrates the number of publications by topic and type of publication. It can be identified some patterns in 2023. While the dissemination of research in architecture and planning prioritises book chapters, scientific papers represent a major channel to publish research on arts and culture, housing, sustainability and tourism, innovation, and job quality. DC members actively participate in scientific events, publishing the respective proceedings. This pattern continues across the six broad subjects (see Chart 2). However, there is a more balanced distribution across these subjects for both scientific papers and book chapters.

If we compare the current assessment period with the previous one, the focus on publishing book chapters, or articles and proceedings indexed in databases such as WoS and Scopus becomes even more pronounced (see Chart 3). So, the DC members are encouraged to find out the appropriate channels to place their research at national and international levels, and through varying types of publications.

Chart 1. Number of DC publications by topic and type of publication (2023)

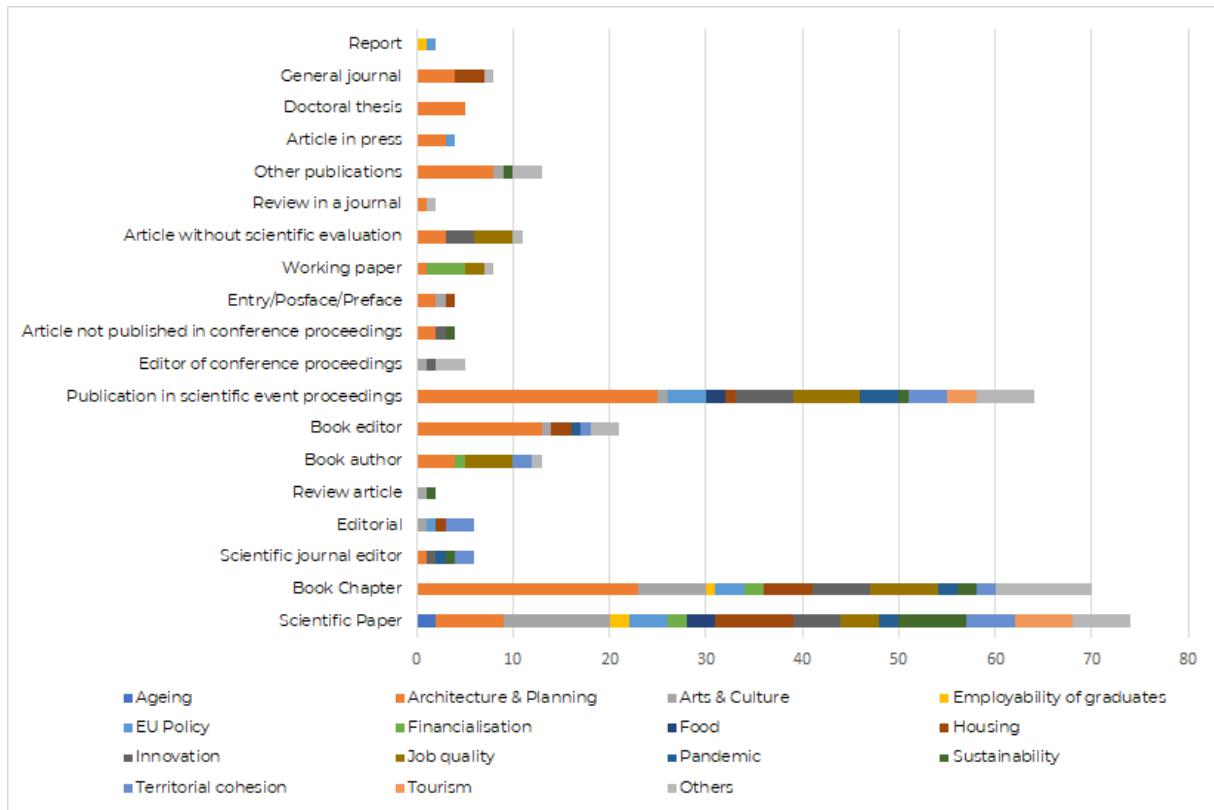


Chart 2. Number of DC publications by research key area and type of publication (2023)

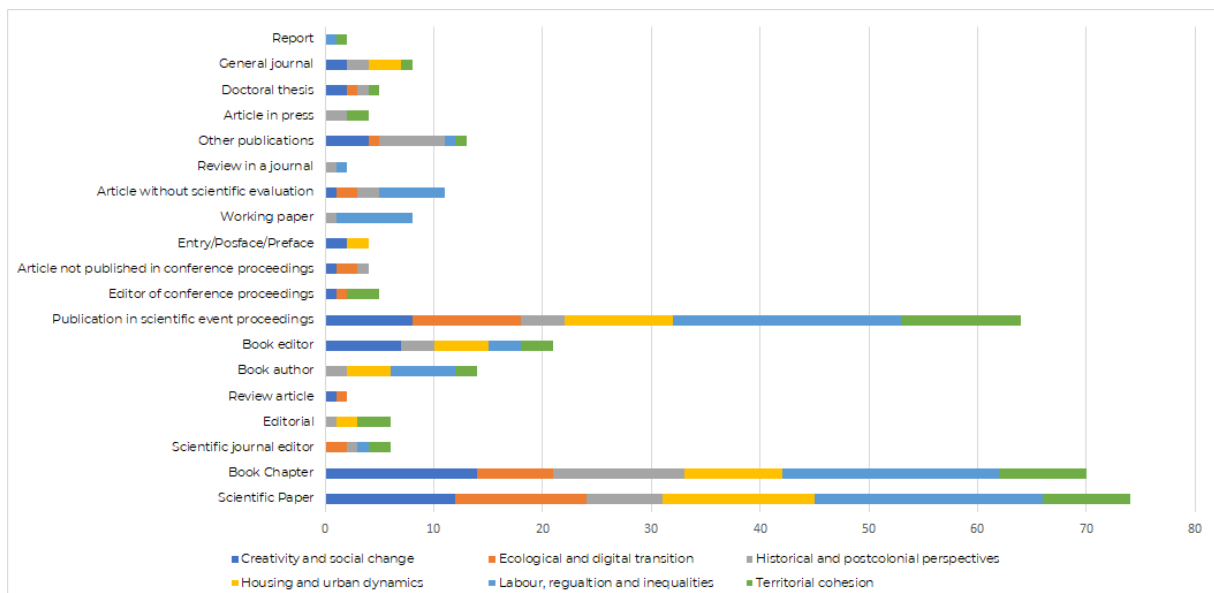
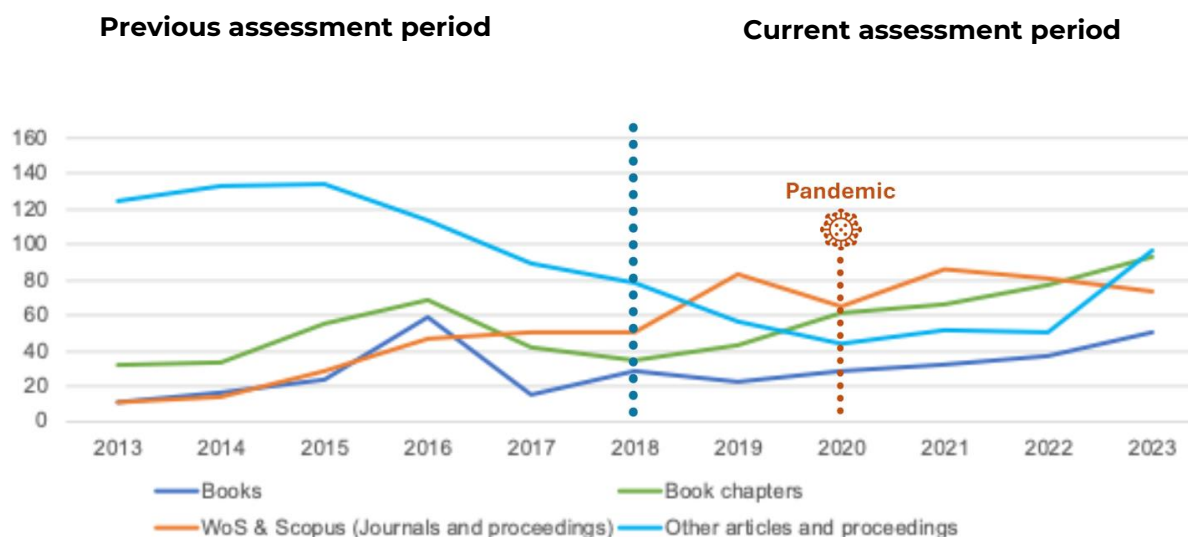


Chart 3. Number of DC publications by type of publication (current and previous assessment period)



2.3. Main facts and outputs

A quantitative overview of the main facts and outputs from research that was undertaken throughout the year is available in the appendix section of this report, namely the synthesis of indicators by research groups: Innovation and Labour, Cities and Territories and Governance Economy and Citizenry. A summary of the key findings based on these figures are presented below.

- Innovation and Labour (IL)** – In 2023 there were 7 collective projects within IL, including two (2) starting this year, adding to the two (2) ongoing projects funded by FCT, one (1) project with European funding and one (1) funded by another international source. The Youth Employment Observatory, launched in October 2021, adds to this set. The number of articles published in journals indexed in WoS and Scopus was higher (25) than that of 2022 (21). There was also an improvement in proceedings (24 in 2023, compared to 13 in 2022). This contributed to the overall improvement in the total number of publications (85 in 2023, 79 in 2022). The number of events organized by this research group remained stable (10), similar to paper presentations at scientific events, 74. In terms of advanced training, one (1) PhD thesis and 38 Master theses were concluded within the scope of this RG, with 6 PhD projects underway.
- Cities and Territories (CT)** – In 2023, thirteen (13) new research projects were added to the 20 already in progress through various funding sources. Among these new projects, two (2) have national funding via FCT, one (1) is sponsored

by another national entity, and two (2) have international funding. The LXHabidata platform is running under DC Strategic Plan financial support, since it was launched in 2021. Also noteworthy was the news that, along with the ERC Grant in progress (GA949686), an additional one was achieved also under this RG, to begin in 2024. Regarding publications, there was significant improvement in the total figures (253 publications) compared to the previous year (190), which translates into more articles indexed in WoS and Scopus (39), doubling book chapters (61) and 106 paper presentations in scientific events. In terms of advanced training, eight (8) PhD thesis and 23 Master theses were concluded within the scope of this RG, with 43 PhD projects underway.

- **Governance, Economy and Citizenry (GEC)** – In 2023, four (4) new research projects were started under this RG, funded by national entities, adding to the one (1) already underway. The total number of publications decreased compared to the previous year (53 in 2023/ 66 in 2022). The number of articles indexed in WoS and Scopus was 15 (19 in 2022), and the number of book chapters was slightly lower (16 in 2023/ 19 in 2022). This RG saw the greatest improvement in paper presentations (36 in 2023/ 24 in 2022) in scientific events (national and international) and in advanced training, with two (2) PhD thesis and 76 Master theses completed, while 18 PhD projects were in progress.

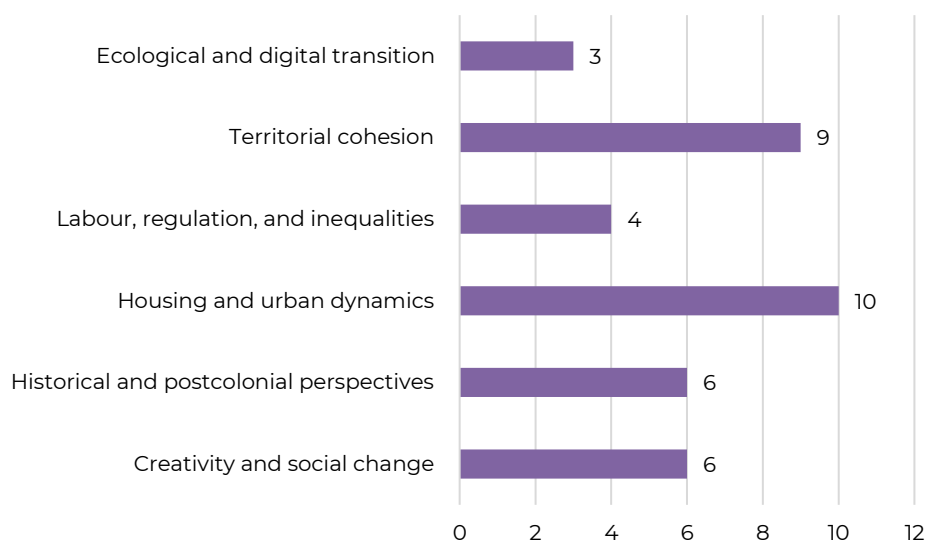
2.4. Research activities: applications, projects, funding, forfeited overheads

41 collective project applications were completed throughout the year, with a very substantial increase in the response to international funding calls (68%). FCT calls represented less than one third (29%) of submitted proposals. Along with previous year successful applications, this resulted in 12 new collective projects starting in 2023 (for details, see [Appendix 4](#)).

Throughout the year, 38 funded and non-funded collective research projects, with different funding sources, were undergoing with the leadership or contribution of DC team members. Now, less than one third of collective research funding (29%) comes from FCT programmes, 16% result from European Commission initiatives, 24% are contracted with municipalities and other national public sources, while the remaining 32% have different or self-funding sources.

Chart 4 shows how the projects underway during 2023 cover the DC's major subjects, with a prevalence of housing and urban dynamics and territorial cohesion.

Regarding the financial contribution of project funding to the Unit's activity, we may have a look at how forfeited overheads have advanced in recent years.

The next table provides more detailed and evolving information on the projects' budget.

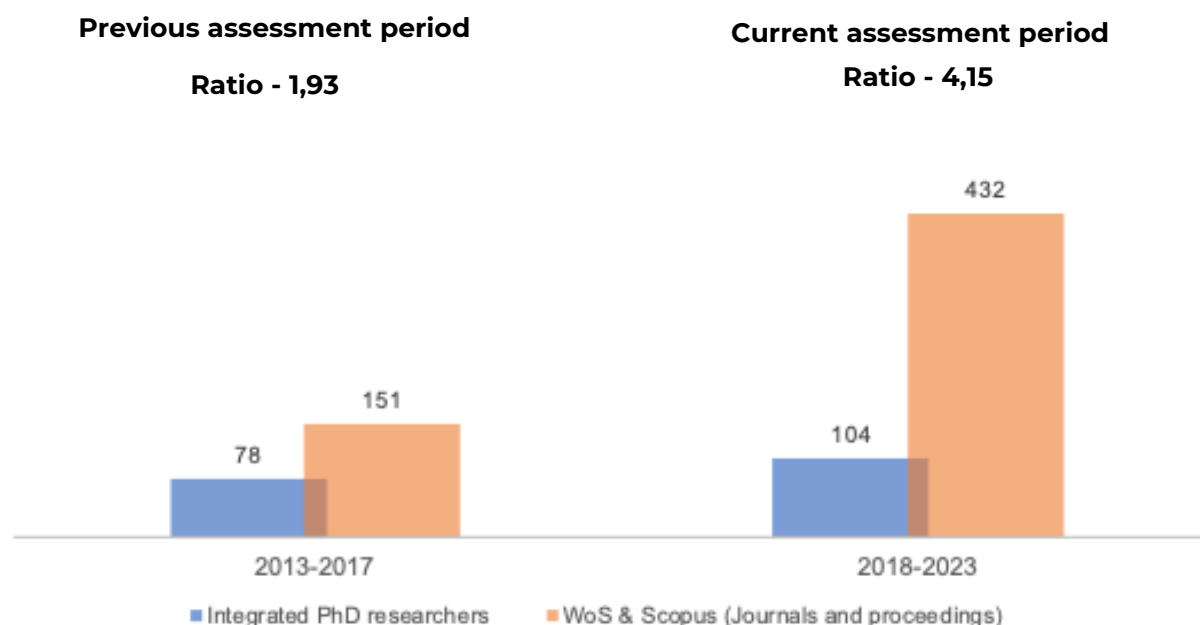
Funding sources' incentive to the professionalization of research unfolded in higher figures for individual project applications. The 6th edition of FCT's Stimulus of Scientific Employment resulted in 14 applications with DC as host institution. Along with the 3 successful applications to this programme, DC renewed the contract of 2 researchers supported by strategic and programmatic funding, reinforcing a team of now 14 full-time PhD researchers (see [appendix 5](#) for details).

Indirect funding to junior researchers was also provided mainly by FCT, whose individual grant programme resulted in 7 applications stating DC as host institution, 4 of which were successful. By the end of 2023, DC had 28 PhD students with FCT individual grants and an additional 4 with programmatic funding.

2.5. Research results: publication, events, networks, articulation with advanced training

DC continues to foster quality publication of research results. Overall publication figures have risen, and outputs have diversified, with improved productivity (publications/researchers): 108 articles, 73 proceedings, 51 books, 93 chapters, 66 other publications (see [Appendix 2](#) for detailed information). When we compare the current assessment period with the previous one, we see that there has been a significant increase in the ratio between the number of integrated PhD researchers and the number of publications indexed on WoS and Scopus (see Chart 5).

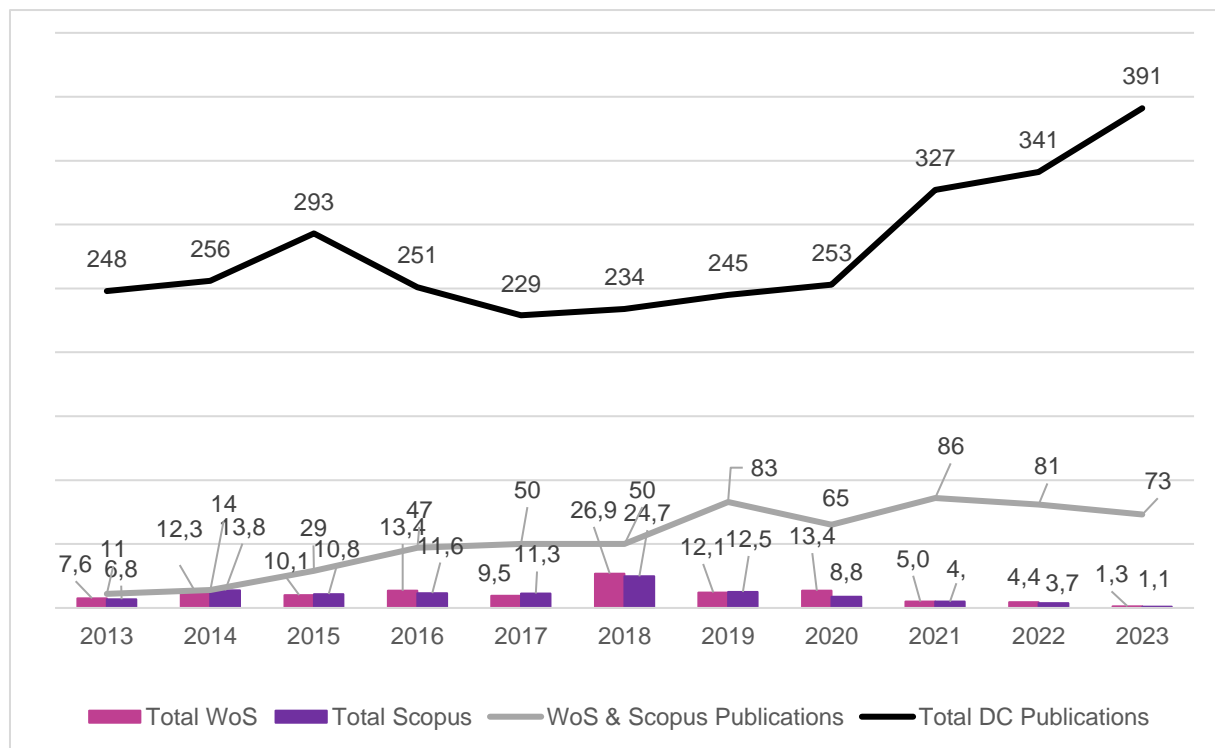
Chart 5. Ratio between the number of integrated PhD researchers and the number of publications indexed on WoS and Scopus (current and previous assessment period)



The impact of publication: citations and DC publication

The data on citations regarding DC publication was retrieved from WoS/Clarivate and Scopus databases, which means that only publications indexed in those databases is featured – which represents 19% of the overall publication for 2023, for instance. Since this is an indicator that best provides a long-term perspective of the impact of edited scientific production, we chose to look at the past 10 years. There was a slightly upward trend with a peak in 2018, while more recent work has not yet been referred. Noteworthy is the significant increase in the number of publications in recent years.

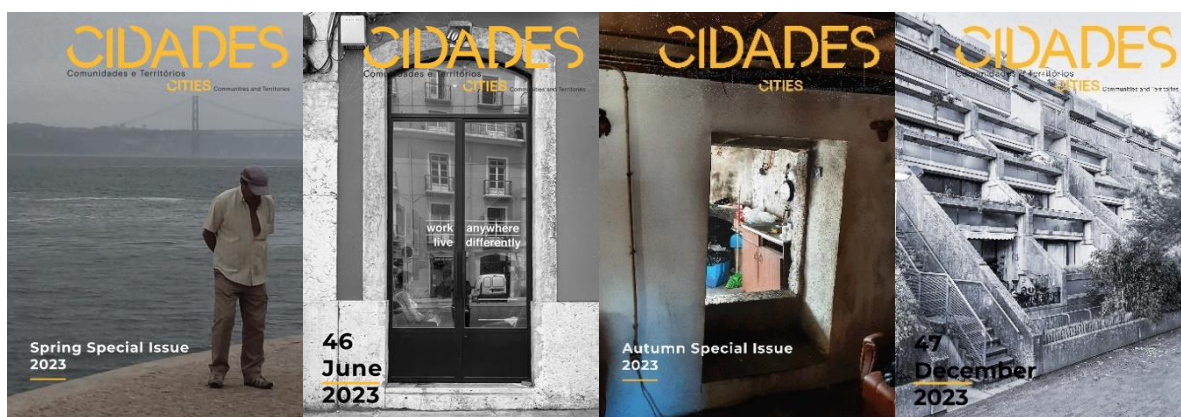
Following international and FCT guidelines, DC has been progressively increasing its presence in open access domains. *CIDADES, Comunidades e Territórios* (CCT) has added to its listing in Scopus, Web of Science's SciELO citation index, SciELO and Open Edition, Latindex Catalogue 2.0. Following several years' push for special issues adding to two regular ones, it has officially transitioned to a triannual publication schedule. *Working Papers* are published on the DC website and Iscte

Repository and materials resulting from public funding are also uploaded on to this Repository, integrated in RCAAP - Repositório Científico de Acesso Aberto de Portugal, or on alternative open access domains, in line with national and European guidelines.

Chart 7 illustrates the consolidation in published articles at *CIDADES, Comunidades e Territórios*, with an increase of rejections as a consequence of stricter criteria for initial appraisal ('desk reject').

Chart 7. Submissions, publication and rejections rates at CCT (2021-2023)



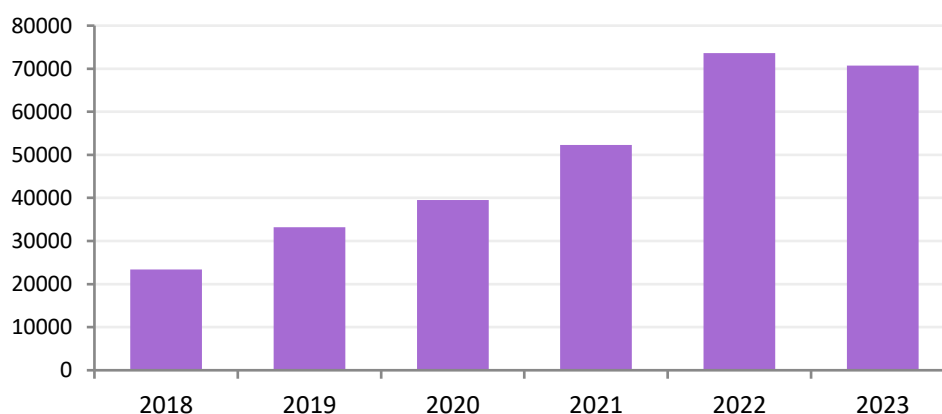

Chart 8 illustrates the growing scope of DC publications available through Iscte Repository, in chronological terms. 2023 records show a slight decrease in download figures.

The articulation between advanced training and research is consistently growing at DC, which is now in charge of managing 3 PhD programmes (Political Economy, Urban Studies and the recently approved Transitions to Sustainability), the first 2 jointly organized with other teaching institutions, along with the Economics and Architecture of Contemporary Metropolitan Territories at Iscte.

2.6. Youth Employment Observatory and LXHabidata

Youth Employment Observatory

The Youth Employment Observatory was launched in 2021 and is coordinated by Professor Fátima Suleman and Professor Paulo Marques. It is part of the DC and is funded by FCT - Foundation for Science and Technology. The YEO aims to create a repository of content and research dedicated exclusively to the youth labour market, taking advantage of synergies and spaces for interaction between DC's research projects dedicated to studying labour.

The Observatory focuses on three areas of study - youth unemployment, quality of youth employment, and labour market policies directed at young labour market participants. The project's central objective is to produce publications that highly impact society, namely reports and policy briefs, and to provide regularly updated key data.

In 2023, the response to this objective was expressed in the following highlights:

White paper “More and Better Jobs for Young People”

- In the aftermath of the report's launch in 2022, the Observatory and the co-authoring entities were invited to present the main conclusions of the study to a variety of audiences:
 - 12th January, Barcelona: YoPeVa international workshop, an invitation from the Portuguese Youth Foundation.
 - 13th February, Lisbon: presentation to the Portuguese Economic and Social Council, a constitutional body for social concertation.
 - 26th February, Guimarães: presentation at the National Youth Gathering, where the closing event for the European Year of Youth took place.
- Fundação José Neves, co-author of the report, gathered over 50 large Portuguese companies to sign the “More and Better Jobs for Young People” Pact. The Observatory is one of the associate entities.

Committee for the Sustainability of Social Security report

- The Observatory was invited to co-author a survey-based study on perceptions of young people in Portugal regarding the national pension system. The study takes place in the context of the creation of a committee designated to study and assess the sustainability of the Social Security system in Portugal.

IEFP protocol and first report

- In January 2023, Iscte – University Institute of Lisbon, through the Observatory, signed a protocol with the Portuguese public employment

services, IEF, establishing the cooperation in the development of a series of studies on Youth Employment, Unemployment and Labour Market Policies.

- In November, the first study was published, with the title “Who are the young unemployed?”. The report profiled and analyzed youth unemployment in Portugal, between 2019 and 2022, and offered recommendations of priority measures to address the different types of youth unemployment.

Re-launch of the Key Indicators on the Observatory website

- The Key Indicators featured on the Observatory website were re-designed so as to reveal a more complete, relevant and up to date picture of the youth labour market in Portugal.

Other events and partnerships:

The Observatory and its researchers have been involved in a variety of events and partnerships relating to the subject of youth employment.

The impact on society has also been reflected through participation in the debates generated in the public sphere through interviews, comments, and opinions (7 participations in television programmes, 11 interviews/reportages in printed media, 4 radio interviews). These participations have been remarkably successful, given how the media have integrated and explored several of the Observatory’s themes and contributions.

The work carried out in 2023 ensured the necessary continuity of the Observatory’s activity, while also enabling the team to find new lines of development.

LxHabidata

LxHabidata is a DC project and initiative, designed in the wake of the conference ‘Lisbon, which future?’, held at Iscte in April 2017, where the explosion of housing prices, the tourism boom, and local accommodation were discussed. Coordinated by researchers Sandra Marques Pereira and Madalena Matos, this is a platform of housing data permanently updated for the municipalities and parishes of the Lisbon Metropolitan Area. It is designed for all those who are interested in the subject of housing: citizens, public policy makers, and practitioners, researchers, promoters, etc.

During 2023, LxHabidata carried out the following activities:

1. Update and creation of new LxHabidata indicators;

2. Online survey of tenants (sample of approximately 2000 respondents) - construction and launch of the survey, and beginning of data analysis;
3. Beginning of a social characterisation study of private sector tenants;
4. Development of a proposal for a Housing Observatory (associated with LxHabidata) submitted in a call launched by DC.

3. THE INTERNATIONALIZATION

The reinforcement of the internationalisation process is a key outcome of the 2023. This process includes the continuity of the work carried out within the project *ReARQ.IB - Built Environment Knowledge for Resilient, Sustainable Communities: Understanding Everyday Modern Architecture and Urban Design in the Iberian Peninsula (1939-1985)* - European Research Council Starting Grant (GA949686) - coordinated by Ricardo Agarez.

Our overarching approach towards research is also reflected in terms of external contributors to DC projects. Not only does one third of funding result from international sources (see [table 2](#)) but also a great number of partners, arriving from 17 countries (52% of all project partners), as shown on the next chart.

Chart 9. Collective research projects partners (countries) in 2023

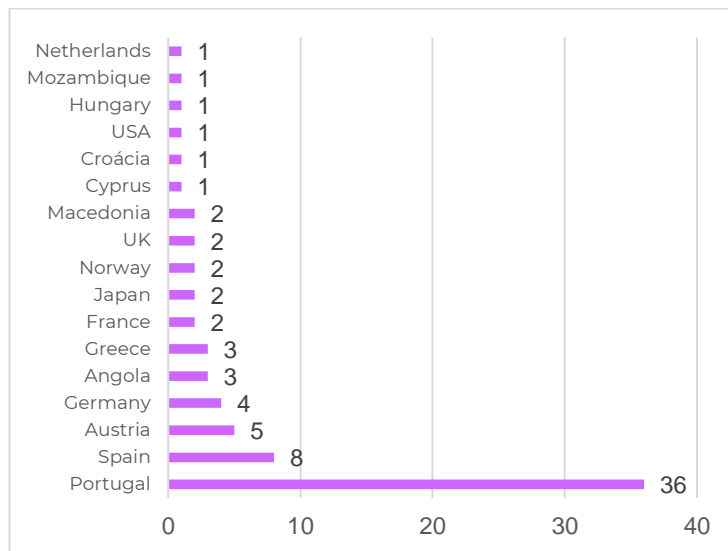
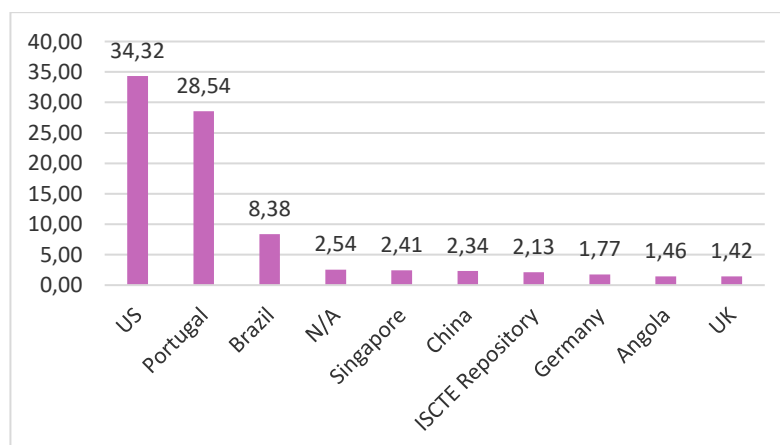


Chart 10. Iscte Repository: DC documents downloads top 10 countries in 2023 (%)



Internationalization of research is also translated into countries where DC researchers published in 2023, with 66% of publication occurring on international journals, proceedings and other foreign domains.

Similarly, after recent years of limited travel due to Covid-19, international conferences and similar events have returned as meeting points for scientific discussion. DC researchers presented 216 papers in 26 different countries in 2023.

Scientific discussion is highly promoted on site at Iscte, through both national and international events taking place throughout the year – 50 in total, which included 9 international conferences (see [Highlights for the year](#) for additional details).

Chart 11. Countries where DC researchers published in 2023²



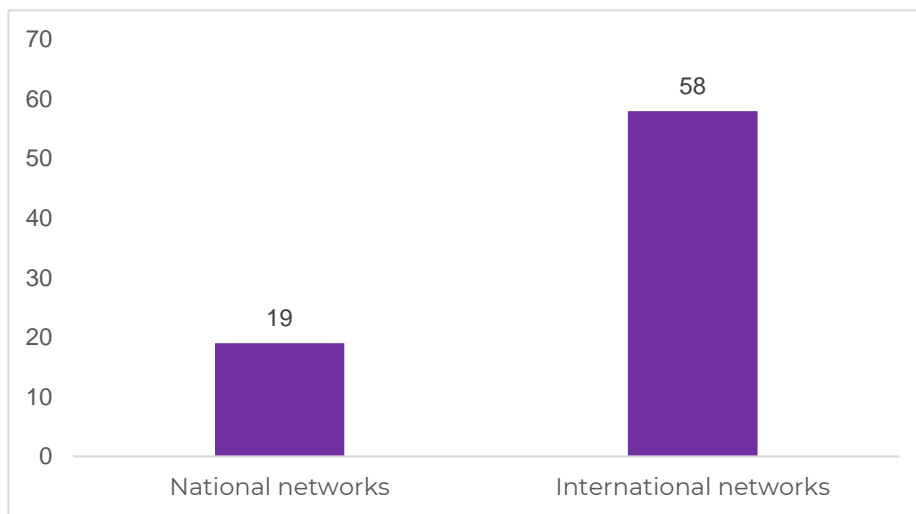
Chart 12. Countries where DC researchers presented papers in 2023

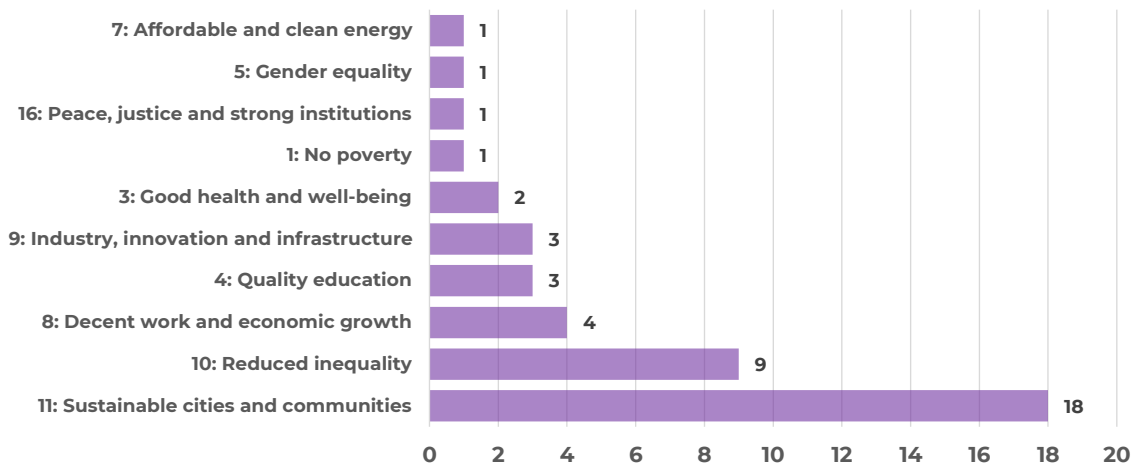
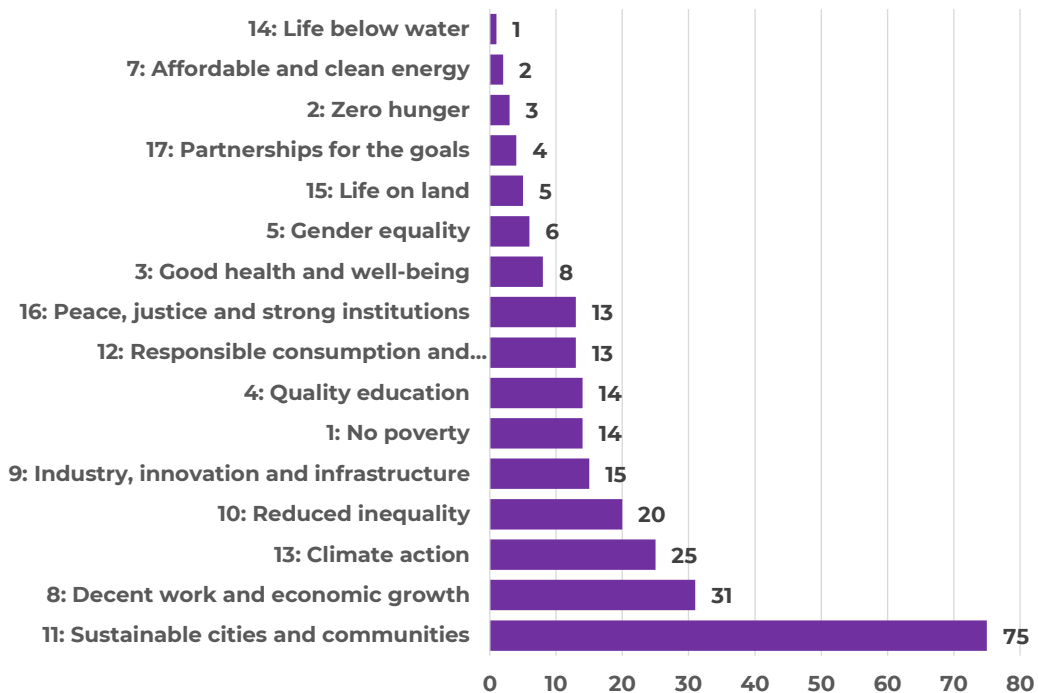


Chart 15. Publications aligned with UN Sustainable Development Goals (2023)

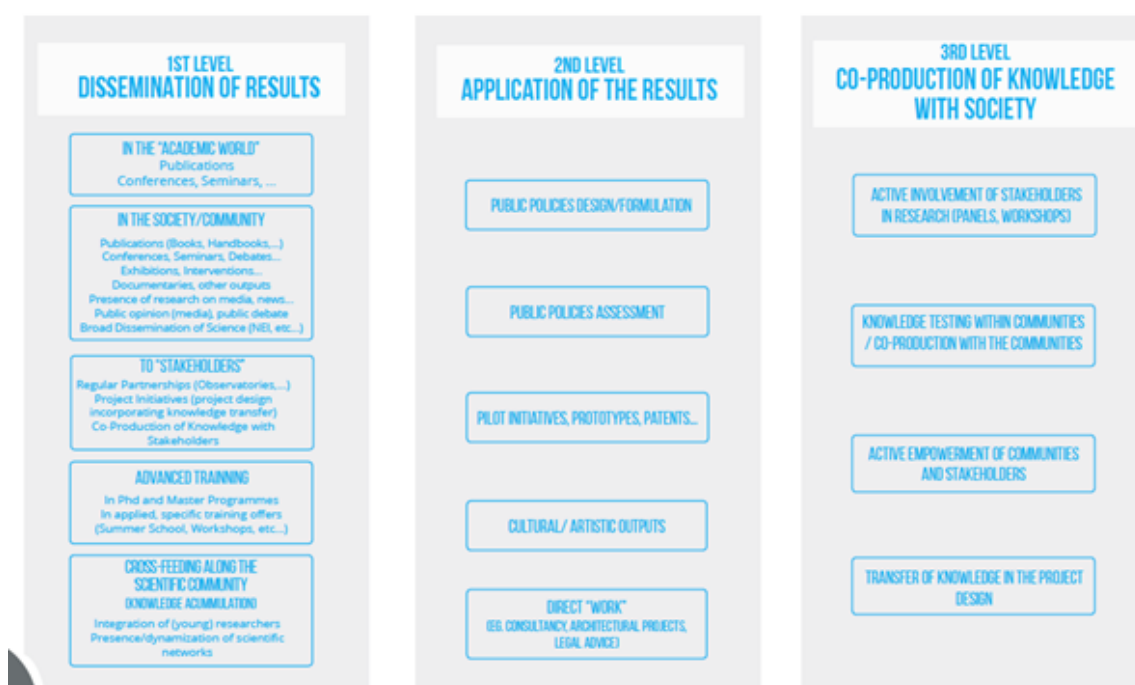

SOCIAL IMPACT OF OUR RESEARCH

THE DISSEMINATION OF KNOWLEDGE AND SOCIAL IMPACTS OF OUR RESEARCH CAN BE SEEN AT 3 PARALLEL LEVELS



The activity of each of the research groups meets these three parallel levels, as the following highlights show.

Innovation and Labour (IL)

Dissemination of results

Within the scope of the Youth Employment Observatory (YEO) - production of annual reports on unemployment, job quality and youth employment policies, production of Policy Briefs on relevant youth employment issues, participation in scientific and other events targeting a wider public, participation in the media - written press and TV and radio debates. Presentation of the results of completed projects to social actors of national and regional scope.

Within the scope of research on accelerating transitions to low carbon - publication of articles in top scientific journals, book chapters, policy briefs, presentation in conferences, participation in seminars and international reference networks,

leadership of international research projects. Two international Conferences were organized in ISCTE: 2023 Annual EDITS Meeting (November), and International Conference on Industry 4.0 and Smart Manufacturing (November); and two national events - a Colloquium on 'The decent work agenda and changes to labour law' (April) and a Conference on Digital Transition and Labour Law: what challenges? (March).

Within the scope of research on labour market transformations, job quality, segmentation, education and skills - publication in top scientific journals, conferences and international reference networks. Dissemination also involved books ('Economia do Trabalho – Mercados e Instituições', 'Negociação-fundamentos, competências e prática', 'A Persistência da Desvalorização do Trabalho e a Urgência da sua Revalorização' and 'Cultura organizacional, comprometimento e responsabilidade social corporativa') to publish research findings, in addition to the traditional publication types of the Labour group. The press, TV and radio continue to be a crucial channel of dissemination.

Application of the results

Within the scope of the Youth Employment Observatory (YEO), publication of the report on 'Who are the young unemployed? Diagnosis and Recommendations', for the IEFP.

Articles in the press to alert public opinion and public decision-makers to the consequences of the digital and ecological transition on work and employment.

Co-production of knowledge with society

Within the scope of the Youth Employment Observatory (YEO) - preparation of intervention mechanisms with entities related to youth employability, which included the publication of the Report 'Who are the young unemployed? Diagnosis and Recommendations', for the IEFP.

Regarding the work on sustainability transitions, an international event was organized: the 2023 Annual EDITS Meeting - Conference on improving wellbeing while avoiding dangerous climate change.

Cities and Territories (CT)

Dissemination of results

In parallel to the dissemination of results in multiple international/national academic events, the CT group has (co-)organized 3 medium-large international conferences during 2023: 'XI International Conference of the Portuguese-Language Network of Urban Morphology (PNUM), Iscte-Sintra"; "III Encontro Internacional da Rede Todas as Artes | Todos os Nomes. Faculdade de Letras da Universidade do Porto, Porto"; "IVth Architectures of The Soul Conference" in, Batalha, as well as multiple smaller scale international/national/local seminar and events.

Several roundtables, open talks and book launches, all around the year and in multiple spaces, enabled visibility of the work of CT's group within and outside academic world, disseminating its results to broader audiences.

Various exhibitions in important national cultural institutions (Fundação Marques da Silva, Centro Cultural de Belém, etc.) were based on the work and disseminated research conducted in the scope of this group's activity.

The research of this group in one of its key areas (Housing) was broadly disseminated through the 2023 annual report on “Estado da Nação e as Políticas Públicas”, initiative of IPPS-Iscte

Several researchers were assiduous presence in media and public space, namely in the discussion of pressing current territorial issues such housing dynamics or participatory processes (e.g. S. M. Pereira, A. Paio, A. B. Guterres, S. Santos...), and many other participated in specific events and discussion moments in multiple institutions throughout the city and the country.

The annual seminar events related to the two main PhD programmes related to this RG (Colóquio Território Metropolitanos Contemporâneos, at CIUL, and Jornadas de Estudos Urbanos, at Iscte), are important moments for sharing the results of students' work, not only within the community of each PhD programme, but also with the broader community.

Application of the results

Several ongoing (and recently concluded) projects in this RG, by their own nature, are directly focused on the design, monitoring and/or evaluation of public policies, including, for example, at national policies level, the ICA project (assessment of previous cinema/audiovisual sector policy and collaboration in the definition of new national strategy – which was launched at the end of 2023), or at municipal level, the projects to the city councils of Cascais (on ageing strategy) or Loures (on social inclusion strategy). At European policies level, several projects (Re-Dwell, Stronger Peripheries) are generating policy guidelines and public policies recommendations.

Two toolkits have been developed for cultural institutions (an audiences analysis toolkit, and another one for analysing the quality of participation in cultural activities), both under the Stronger Peripheries project, which are being tested and used by various cultural institutions throughout Southern Europe and the Balkans.

The tool for self-assessment of impacts of cultural activities (and assessment of the activity of cultural and creative tourism organizations) that has been developed and made available (on the Culture.Impacts.DIY platform), as result of several DC's projects, is available for free use (and being used) by agents in the sector, in Portugal and abroad.

Co-production of knowledge with society

Most of the projects conducted in this RG have in its design the concern with the co-production and validation of knowledge with the stakeholders and communities involved in those projects, as well as the empowerment of those stakeholders and transferring of knowledge (e.g., Stronger Peripheries or Impacts-ARTEMREDE-impacts, co-produced toolkits for use of stakeholders and artistic communities and city councils)

In general, policy-oriented projects (e.g., Estratégia ICA, Cascais-Envelhecimento) as strategic plans, involve from their initial design the actors and stakeholders both

in the diagnosis of the reality as well as in the definition of strategic guidelines and action plans.

LxHabidata activity during 2023 included the update and creation of new LxHabidata indicators, and an online survey of tenants, with the beginning of a social characterisation study of private sector tenants, in articulation with the sector.

Several collective projects (e.g., Re-Dwell, Stronger Peripheries) as well as many ongoing individual PhD thesis in this group deal with the reflexivity on the concept and practices of participation, in several domains (political, urban, artistic, social), and therefore by their nature have an important role in knowledge transfer and co-production with communities, policy makers and other stakeholders.

Several ongoing projects (e.g., BipZip participations) are direct participative experiences, in which the research teams assume their role in a collective territorial endeavor, naturally co-producing and transferring knowledge with communities and empowering those communities and themselves in the process.

Governance, Economy and Citizenry (GEC)

Dissemination of results

The main vehicles for the dissemination of the results of research carried out by GEC researchers have been their publications in scientific journals, as well as in public magazines and newspapers, their participation in scientific conferences and colloquia, as well as in events for the general public. Also, GEC researchers have been involved in teaching in several Master and PhD programmes of Iscte and of other universities.

Application of the results

The project ImpactPP - Innovation in Public Policies Impact Evaluation: contributions towards the Recovery and Resilience Plan Nacional Pool of Urgent and Temporary Housing. The project aims to develop and test an innovative methodological approach to impact assessment directed to the next generation of public policies financed with European Community funds (2021-2027).

Co-production of knowledge with society

The conference "Hate speech: How to counteract?" brought together academics from different proveniences and disciplinary fields, members of civil society and actors from intergovernmental organizations - to discuss the growth of hate speech in contemporary societies (May, 4-5).

One of the specific objectives set by DC was to reach wider audiences and overall society, both by the active involvement of stakeholders and civil society in the projects' communication design and by improving communication of research results to non-academic audiences. In this sense, the development of initiatives to

promote scientific culture has been one of the Unit's main concerns. It is in this framework that fits its regular participation in the European Researchers' Night.

In 2023, DC participated in the European Researchers' Night with the activity *Arquitectura Aqui at the School: Where did you go to Primary School?*. The activity was coordinated by the researcher Ana Pascoal, as part of the project *ReARQ.IB – Built Environment Knowledge for Resilient, Sustainable Communities: Understanding Everyday Modern Architecture and Urban Design in the Iberian Peninsula (1939-1985)*. The challenge to the public was to share their memories of an emblematic equipment, the primary school. The main aim was to encourage a conversation around the role of collective facilities built in the 20th century in the life of communities and to demonstrate the importance of citizen participation in academic research.

5. THE TEAM

5.1. Researchers (full team per Research Group)

There was an overall consolidation of the team in recent years, both across research groups and categories. By the end of 2023, DC reached a total of 234³ members in its research team, distributed among the different categories and RG as follows:

- 107 integrated researchers (IL=23; CT=62; GEC=22);
- 96 assistant researchers (IL= 12; CT=76; GEC=8);
- 31 associate researchers (IL=6; CT=16; GEC=9).

Chart 16. Researchers per category (2021-2023)

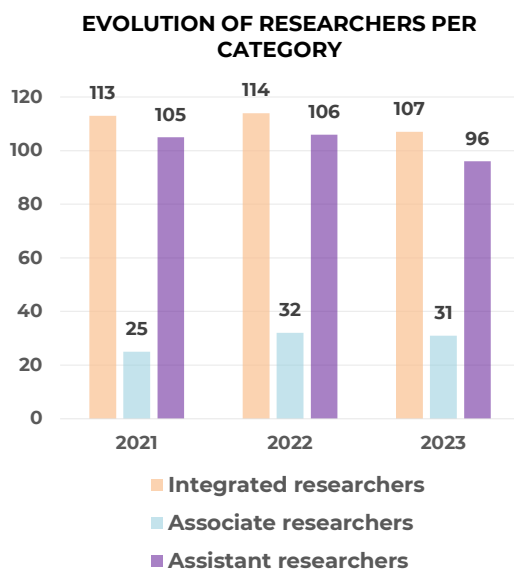
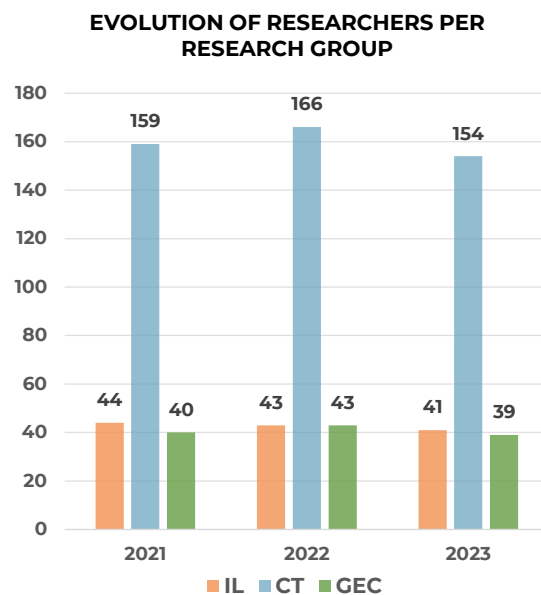


Chart 17. Researchers per RG (2021-2023)



Sociodemographic profile

Gender distribution throughout the team is nearly even (in 2023, F=54,3%, M=45,7%). There seems to be a trend towards the professionalization of research, bearing in mind the increased proportion of full-time researchers within Integrated researchers, while ISCTE faculty still makes up the largest part of this group (in 2023, Faculty=43,0%; FTR=19,6%; Other=37,4%)

Chart 18. Researchers by gender (2023)

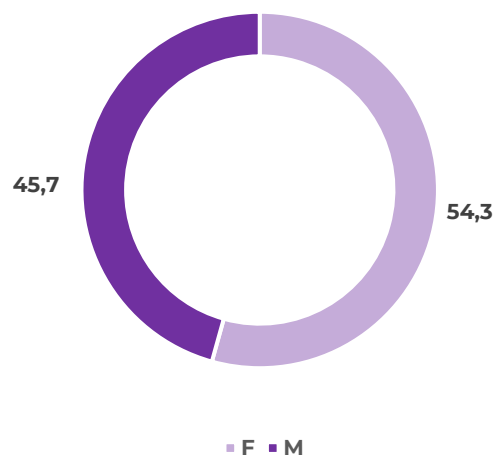
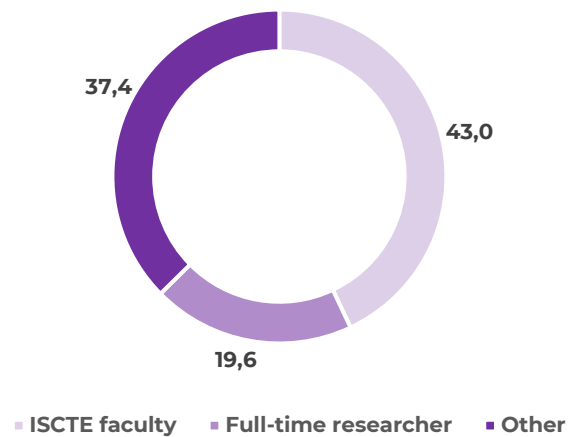


Chart 19. Integrated researchers by employment link (2023)

Architecture weighs even more when we consider integrated researchers without a PhD, in terms of their initial training. This is very much a reflection of the proportion of PhD students in architectural courses in our team ([see Appendix 6](#))

Chart 20. Integrated researchers' scientific domain (2023)

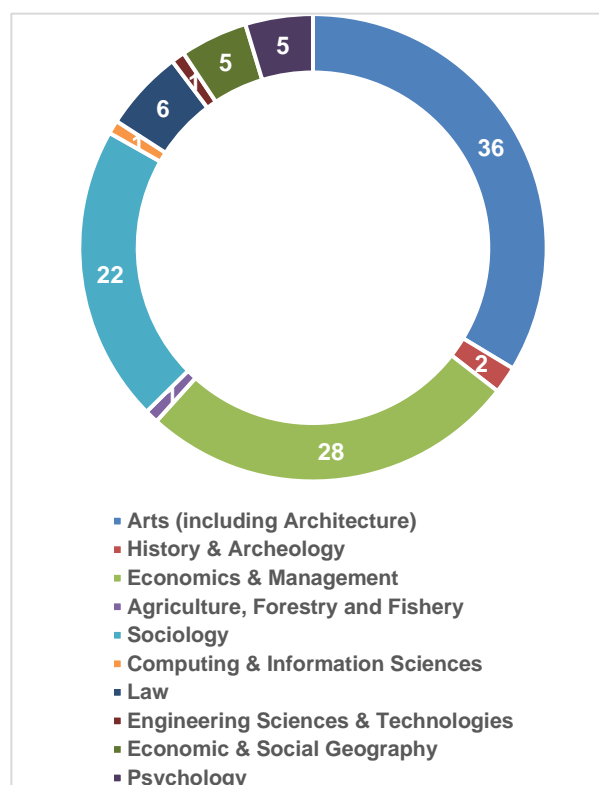
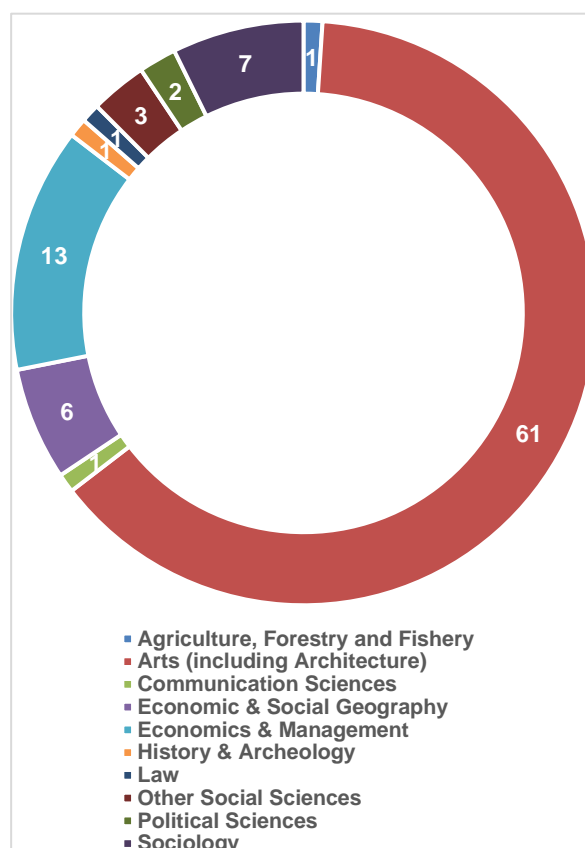


Chart 21. Assistant researchers' scientific domain (2023)

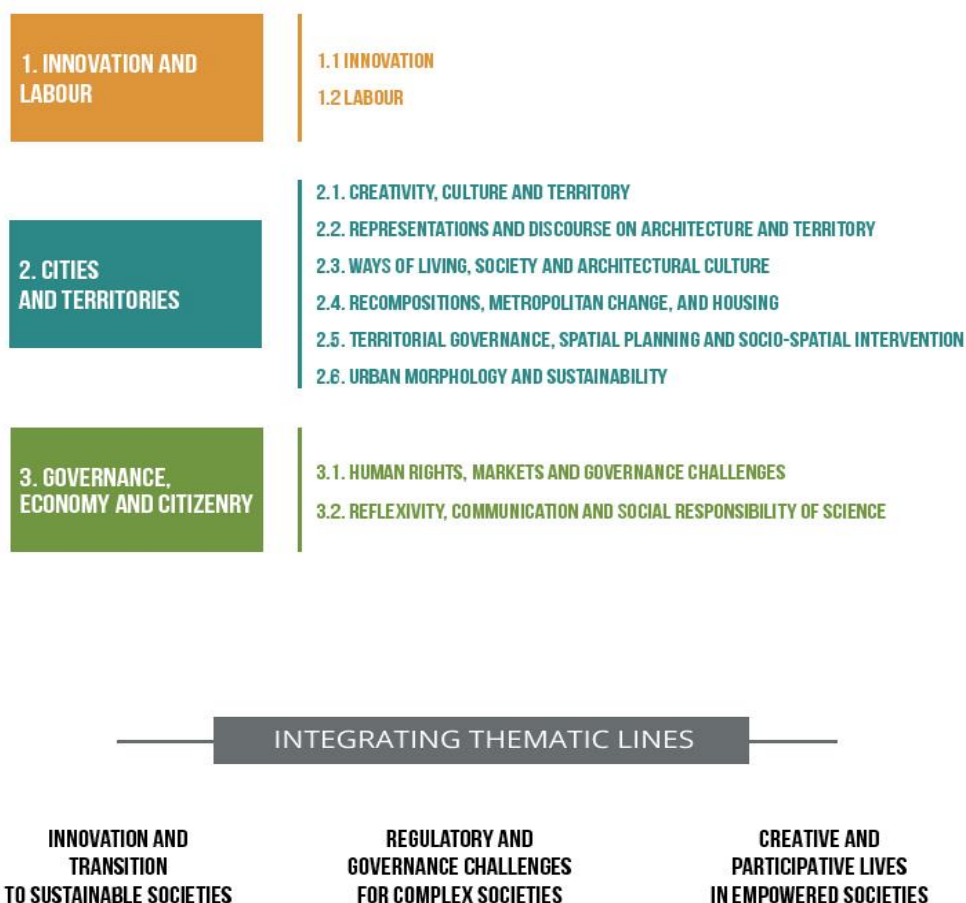
